
Daslne

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Launched October 2003

Partnership between parents, professionals and academics

Aims to provide accurate information about numbers & needs

Progress



- Renewed Health Ethics
 - Letter to young people at age 18 years
- Published papers
 - 2 published 2015
 - 3 in preparation (age at diagnosis, gender differences, change over time in behaviour problems)
- Information for Local Authorities
 - E.g. Newcastle autism scrutiny group; Gateshead;
 Sunderland (numbers in each year of secondary)

Progress



- Eight research studies supported with recruitment in last 12 months, e.g.
 - 'Ups and Downs' project (Newcastle)
 - 'Seeing the world differently' (London)
 - Intervention to prevent temper outbursts (Belfast)
- Research committee meets 5 times a year, including 6 parent representatives
- ASD+ project involved 658 families (ASD-UK/Daslne)
